## COMMUNITY PROFILE

Tesoro High School is one of six comprehensive high schools in the Capistrano Unified School District. Tesoro opened in the fall of 2001 and currently serves 2,500+ students in grades 9-12. Students come from several south Orange County communities: Rancho Santa Margarita, Las Flores, Dove Canyon, Coto de Caza, Rancho Mission Viejo, Trabuco Canyon, Mission Viejo, and Ladera Ranch. The school benefits from a supportive and active community and maintains many vital business partnerships. Two community foundations and the Parent Teacher Student Association work diligently to support the staff and students with their work. Over 90% of parents have a college degree or some graduate/post graduate education.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The school year consists of two semesters and is 180 days in length. Students earn 5 credits per class per semester. Freshmen and Sophomores are required to take a minimum of six classes; Juniors and Seniors must take a minimum of five classes.

## GPA AND ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

Grade Point Average is calculated on a 4 point scale: A = 4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and F=0. Advanced Placement and Honors courses receive weighted grades: A=5, B=4, C=3, D=1, and F=0. Physical education classes are not included in the computation of the academic GPA with the exception of determining eligibility for athletics. A repeated class is indicated by an "r" on the transcript and additional credit is not awarded; the higher grade received is used in GPA computations.

**COLLEGE & CAREER ADVANTAGE PATHWAYS**

**Business and Finance Pathway**

Courses in Business Management and Accounting prepare students with a strong foundation for any college-bound students who are interested in majoring in any Accounting or Business Administration degree program. Students will learn generally accepted accounting principles and learn how to formulate an operable business plan upon completion of this pathway.

**Careers in Teaching Pathway**

This is a two year pathway designed to provide students with knowledge of career opportunities in the field of teaching and in other school site educational professions. Students are required to observe and participate in a variety of settings and classrooms at the elementary and secondary levels. Students will learn how to prepare and present weekly educational plans using a variety of options. Preparation of lesson plans, classroom management, and organizational skills are also covered in this pathway.

**Design, Visual and Media Arts Pathway**

Multiple courses in design and media arts are available to provide students with career skills in graphic arts and production, broadcasting, animation, video production, audio and music technology, and others. The teachers of these courses partner with industry representatives to ensure that the equipment used in the course meets current trends and the curriculum addresses the employment skills needed to be successful in this field.

**Medical Pathway**

Courses in Medical Core and Sports Medicine with background the area of health sciences. Students will learn the concepts and techniques used in the healthcare field that apply to many entry level healthcare careers. There is a focus on the care, prevention and rehabilitation of athletic injuries and students completing the courses will receive CPR certification.

**Performing Arts Pathway**

Courses in Drama, Advanced Drama and Actors Repertory prepare students for a career in the performing arts. Students are required to complete a series of competency-based courses before graduation. In addition to the performing arts, students are able to take courses in the behind-the-scenes programs such as Theatrical Production and Stagecraft. Successful students will be prepared to enter into a conservatory/collegiate program and pursue a career in performing arts.

**EXTRACURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES**

Students are offered a full range of co-curricular activities that enhance classroom learning. Athletic teams participate in the very competitive South Coast and Sea View leagues at the Freshmen, Junior Varsity, and Varsity levels.

83% of students scored a 3 or higher compared to the 61% global rate

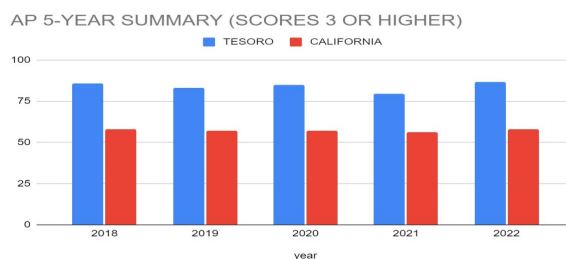

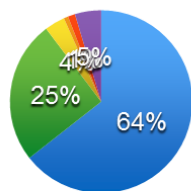
